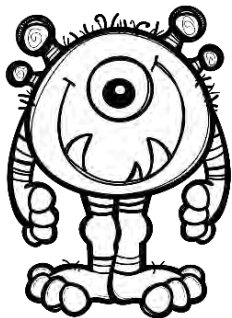


# comprehension

**How to Play:** Ready to discuss text? Pick a circle. Open and close the Cootie Catcher as you say each syllable. (Ex: Train your brain! = 3 syllables, so open/close/open) Peek in, and pick a side. Open and close for each syllable. (Ex: Explain It! = 3 syllables, so open/close/open) On the third time, lift the flap to ask the question! Ready for more? Use this with other books or movies!

- ✓ Does this text provide current information? Explain.
- ✓ What text structure is used? Explain.
- ✓ Is the information in this text accurate? How can you verify the claims?
